Campus Creative Discussion

Plain Pair Groups

- Students are invited to form “creative discussion” groups on campus.
- Each group will meet once a week, in your own free time.
- Each participant should belong to two different groups (one may be your group in class). Each group is a “Pair Group” to the other group.
- Choose “an important topic”, present your ideas and listen attentively to the others.
- Take note of the “best ideas” in the group and present these to the Pair Group, along with your next “important topic”.
- Use the foreign language you are studying.
- Share the speaking time equally. This is important!
- The principle purpose is to develop creativity – listening for great new ideas, not “selling” your own ideas.
- If the group reaches six participants, divide into two separate groups and invite more participants (unless the group was set up by your teacher). Invite people who are “different” – who offer a different point of view.
